Summary The District Action Plans previously presented to Members of the Community

Safety Committee have been superseded by a set of district Priorities in line with the 'Your Fire and Rescue Service' document. The district priorities are designed to complement the high level 'Your Service Priorities', agreed at the Fire and Rescue Authority meeting on 21 February 2020. In addition to the District Priority plans, there is also a set of individual Station Action plans for

each fire station across West Yorkshire.

1 Introduction

1.1 This report seeks approval from Members of the Community Safety Committee on the introduction of the District Priority Plans. The intention is for these to replace the District Action Plans that were previously presented to Members of the Community Safety Committee.

2 Information

- 2.1 In 2019, the District Command teams trialled the use of a set of District Priority Plans that ran in alongside the objectives set out within the District Action Plans. The District Priority plans set more strategic, higher level priorities compared to the District Action Plans.
- 2.2 Feedback from the District Command teams is that they much prefer the District Priority Plans.
- 2.3 The District Priority Plans also complement the new 'Your Service Priorities' with the same branding on the plans and this will deliver a consistent way of reporting against progress.
- 2.4 In addition to the District Priorities, there is now a requirement for all operational fire stations to develop their own annual Action Plans that aim to complement and support the achievement of the District Priorities. In this regard, there exists a thread linking all of these plans together from the local station plans through to the Your Service Priorities set out within the IRMP document.
